Adoption List

As of February 28, 2003 we have placed 964 dogs in adoptive homes. There are, however, 35 Great Danes, 6 Mixes, 21 Saint Bernards, 1 Toy Manchester Terrier, 1 Toy Rat Terrier, and 3 Chihuahuas waiting for suitable homes. Please help us to find good homes for these loving and deserving dogs. All are spayed or neutered, heartworm tested, on heartworm preventative, have received all shots except rabies, have received medical treatment as needed, and have been temperament tested. A fenced yard is required to adopt a dog. Invisible or electric fences are not acceptable.

Adoption Fees: Purebreds (6 months and under)-\$250, (under 4 years)-\$200, (4 years and up)-\$100. Mixes (under 6 months)-\$140, (6 months and up)-\$100. Receive a 5 lb. bag of Science Diet dog food with each adoption.

Obedience

Why do we need it and how should we do it?

Tou have probably noticed I that we recommend obedience training for all dogs going up for adoption. There are several reasons for this. A well mannered dog is a happy dog, and a dog that is well behaved is welcome wherever dogs are allowed. All dogs benefit from training, but this is especially true for large dogs. Great Danes and Saint Bernards because of their size can cause injury without meaning to. A Dane that jumps up to put his paws on the chest or shoulders of a small child or an elderly person will knock them over. You don't have to be frail or unsteady on your feet for this to happen. A boisterous dog can floor any unsuspecting person.

There are other benefits from obedience training. Basic obedience training—especially in a class with other people and their dogs—enhances your relationship with your dog and at the same time helps to socialize the dog with other people and dogs. Training will enable you to communicate with your dog. He wants to please you, but if he doesn't understand what you want from him, he will be confused and unhappy.

How do you choose a trainer or training class? Police or military training is not suitable for the average dog owner. Dogs that are trained to be aggressive can be dangerous when not handled properly. Avoid teaching your dog anything that might be interpreted as aggressive. Do not hand your dog over to someone else to train. You want your dog to obey you and bond

with you. Choose a trainer or school that teaches you to train your dog. Even though you have trained other dogs in the past, your new dog will benefit from training in a class with other dogs. If the trainer uses physical punishment to correct disobedience or takes the leash from you (without your permission) to work with the dog, take your dog out of the class and ask for your money back.

What type of training is best? There are several ways of teaching your dog good manners, but the ones that use positive reinforcement are generally accepted as the best. This means reward for good behavior and withholding reward for bad behavior. The reward usually is praise and more praise for obedience to a command. Some training methods use treats as a reward, but remember that in everyday life you may not always have a treat with you to reward your dog when it comes to you when called or sits on command.

Basic obedience teaches the dog to walk at heel, sit, stay, down, and come. You may discover that you and your dog enjoy the training sessions so much that you wish to continue. There are advanced courses available. You might want to go into agility training or maybe you would like to be able to take your dog to hospitals or nursing homes to visit.

There are a lot of books on dog obedience training available. Check out your local library or book store. Barnes and Noble and Amazon. com have a wide choice. Whatever choice you make, do your dog and yourself a favor—give obedience training serious thought.

Picnic

This year the picnic will not be catered. Bring your own food and beverages. This is a state park—NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ARE PERMITTED. There are grills available, but if you plan to use them, bring charcoal, lighter fluid and utensils.

Rules of the Game

- All dogs must be spayed or neutered, have current licenses, all vaccinations and be on heartworm prevention.
- Dogs must be on a leash no longer than 6 ft. at all times.
- Bring your own pooper scoopers! You are responsible for cleaning up after your own dog.
- If you have friends who might be interested in adopting a Dane or Saint, bring them with you.

If you think your dog won't enjoy the crowd (or "doesn't play well with others"), come anyway and bring pictures.


