- (A) A trust may be created to provide for the care of an animal alive during the settlor's lifetime. The trust terminates upon the death of

the animal or, if the trust was created to provide for the care of more than one animal alive during the settlor's lifetime, upon the death of the last surviving animal.

- (B) A person appointed in the terms of a trust or, if no person is so appointed, a person appointed by the court may enforce a trust authorized by this section. A person having an interest in the welfare of an animal that is provided care by a trust authorized by this section may request the court to appoint a person to enforce the trust or to remove a person appointed.
- (C) The property of a trust authorized by this section may be applied only to its intended use, except to the extent the court determines that the value of the trust property exceeds the amount required for the intended use. Except as otherwise provided in the terms of the trust, property not required for the intended use must be distributed to the settlor if then living or to the settlor's successors in interest.

About the Rescue

HHGDR has operated as a volunteer-run Rescue since 1992. It became a registered 501(c)3 nonprofit in 1998, and to date has placed 1,580 dogs and horses in carefully screened forever homes. HHGDR serves Ohio, extreme north-

ern Kentucky, and parts of eastern Indiana. Currently 16 dogs and 2 horses are available for adoption. In addition, the Rescue houses Sanctuary Dogs living out their lives in the safe environment of the Rescue (the latter unadoptable for health, age, or

other conditions). In 2017, HHGDR spent more than \$20,700 on vet bills alone. Contributions are always welcome and are tax-deductible.

Lurking Spring Dangers by Judy Yacks

While we are all eagerly looking forward to spring and the warm weather it brings, there are definitely some lurking dangers worth considering for your pet. Pets who have spent most of the winter indoors are more susceptible to environmental factors, like chemicals, injuries from overexertion, accidents on slick ground, allergies, and nefarious critters they may find in your yard.

Here are some other cautions:

- If your pet gets most of his exercise with you on weekends, make sure you go back to it slowly. She will not start spring at her peak performance level.
- When playing fetch, use safe hard rubber toys or chucks. Sticks can be dangerous if they splinter or get caught in throats.
- Avoid the temptation of a candy-filled spring holiday basket. Put them up to keep your pup out of the candy hazards like chocolate and artificial sweeteners.
- Watch out for seasonal allergies caused by mold and pollen.
- Fleas, ticks, mosquitoes, spiders...need we say more! Oh, yes, we do....don't forget your **regular** heartworm prevention.
- Like poinsettias, lilies are extremely dangerous to all pets. ALL parts if the plant are poisonous including the flower, pollen, leaves and stem. Display them if you must from up high. Which takes

us to another point, know what plantings in your yard are dangerous, such as Joe Pye weed, lily of the valley, azaleas, and rhododendrons, as well as some mulches, herbicides, fertilizers, and insecticides.

- As the temps heat up keep an eye on your pet's body temp. Give plenty of water and watch for overheating. Watch out for overexposure.
- Spring cleaning? Watch out for your cleaning supplies. That bucket with ammonia, bleach, or solvents can be tempting. Small dogs have also been known to drown in an unwatched bucket of water.
- Microscopic critters hiding out in standing, stagnant water that lead to bacterial and parasitic infections like giardia and leptospirosis.
- Swimming pools! Reacquaint pets with the parameters. Like children, don't leave them unattended, and have fresh water nearby so they do not drink from the pool with its risk of slipping in or drinking the chemicals.
- Fences, leashes, harnesses, and seat belts save lives! Make sure they are in working order.

Attention early in the spring to the dangers of the season will reward you with many healthy and happy summer days with your pets.

Dog Treat Recipe by Judy Yacks

- 4 cups flour
- 1 cup oatmeal
- 1/3 cup oil
- 4 bullion cubes
- 1 1/2 cup water

Dissolve cubes in water. Mix all ingredients.

Roll out 1/4 to 1/2 inch thick. Cut to appropriate size for your dog. Bake at 300 degrees for 25 minutes or until brown and crisp.

Awareness events are held at festivals and pet supply stores. Volunteers set up with educational material provided by the Rescue and bring their dogs along. Passersby meet the successfully adopted dogs and hear about those that still need forever homes.

Volunteers also educate on the pet store/puppy mill connection and the need for spay/neuter of all pets.


